

Saints Rookie League Pushed to June

2020 Season Potential Start

Currently, the state of amateur baseball is closed. There are no games, scrimmages, interactions between teams, until further notice. We all want to play as soon as possible. Once the governor says go, our games can start the next day. If there are special rules that we have to follow, we will get them to you before the season and posted on the website.

Optimistically, we're looking at a potential start date of Wednesday, May 20th home opener against the defending state champion Jordan Brewers.
