**Saints Drop Back-And-Forth  
Battle with Huskies**

After losing a pitchersduel on Monday night at Historic Bentfield Mills, the Saints were on the road yet again, this time at Veterans Memorial Field in Hutchinson. Scoring early runs wasn't an issue for either team on Wednesday night, as the Saints jumped out to a 2-0 lead off of starter Connor Kern in the second inning, only to give that lead right back with the Huskies scoring two of their own in the bottom half. This was the story for the middle innings as well, where the Saints would take three separate leads in the 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, and 5<sup>th</sup> innings. Veteran Husky, Kyle Messner, was able to extinguish the flames, giving up just 2 earned runs in 6.2 relief innings, earning the win.

James Howell started on the mound, following his first Saints win the week prior. Control was a bit of an issue, as he surrendered 6 walks and 2 hit batsmen in his 3 innings of work. Collin Krick then entered the game in the 4<sup>th</sup> inning, eventually working his way out. Collin was solid in relief, striking out three while only giving up 2 earned runs to a strong Hutchinson lineup. He would end up taking the loss as the Huskies were able to score both runs in the 8<sup>th</sup> inning, taking the lead and holding it in the 9<sup>th</sup>.

Ben Lindquist and Jacob Niemela were hot at the plate, each tallying two hits, including a double for each of them. Jim Althoff also had a double that
