weekly recap

THE SAINTS START HOT, WINNING BOTH OPENING WEEK MATCHUPS

For the first time since 2014, the Saints have started the season 2-0 after picking up two wins in Opening Week.

The first win came over the Watertown Red Devils, a team that made a run at Labor Day last season, losing the Class "C" Championship to Sobieski (who is now Class "B"). Collin Krick took the mound on Opening Day and cruised through 6 innings of one-run ball, striking out 5 in the process and collecting the win. James Howell was able to keep Watertown in check in the 7th and 8th inning, and Noah Halonen slammed the door, collecting his first save of the season in the 4-2 win. Offensively, the Saints would collect three runs in the 6th with patient at-bats, inducing four walks from Jim Althoff, Jacob Niemela, Michael Leffler, and Halonen, as well as hits from Jordan Flick and Tyler Brandel. Both Brandel and Niemela had a multi-hit game, as well as Steve Boger with a single and double.

Game two of the week saw an offensive onslaught, with the Saints scoring 14 runs, winning in a mercyruled 7 inning game. The home team reached base 17 times, including second inning home runs from Brandel and Leffler (Leffler's first career). Seven different Saints collected hits on the day, with Boger, Brandel, Krick, and Drew Carlson having multiple knocks.

Jacob Niemela started the game and got the W, and Jordan Flick would relieve him, the two combining for 15 strikeouts (Niemela had 9 in four innings).

The Saints look to keep the ball rolling tomorrow in Cold Spring when they take on the Rockies. Currently, the Rockies have a 2-1 record.
