Angels take Game One of the Week

Heading in to the week, the Saints would have two more chances to smooth out some rough edges before their North Star League opener. First up would be the Minneapolis Angels, a team that would make a Class "A" State Tournament run just last season.

The Saints would throw a mixed bag of pitchers at the Angels. Starting the game was left-hander, Michael Leffler, making his first start of the season. Some control issues in the first inning lead to two runs, but he would settle in and pitch a scoreless second and third inning.

Jim Althoff would take over in relief in the fourth, making his pitching debut for the Saints (he had pitched previously during his time with Albertville). He would also go three innings, giving up just one unearned run before handing the ball over to Paul Vetsch.

"Swiss" would struggle a little in his inning of work, but he would gut it out before turning it over to another Saints debut, Cy Flick.

Cy was able to notch his first strikeout and pitch a scoreless 8th inning, allowing Noah Halonen to take over in the 9th to pitch a scoreless inning of his own.

The Angels pitchers would do a good job working out of jams all game. Although the Saints only scored one run in this 5-1 loss, they would have double digit base runners for the game.

Leading the way on offense was Collin Krick, who was 1-3 with a walk. Ben Lindquist was 1-4 with a double, and also adding hits were Steve Boger, Jim Althoff, and Gus Flick.

Second Minneapolis Team, Second Loss

Facing another tough Class "A" squad, the Minneapolis River Rats, the Saints would drop their second game of the week.

Collin Krick made his third start of the season and looked solid, pitching 5 innings and giving up just two earned runs. A few costly errors, however, would allow the River Rats to tack on two more runs.

James Howell would take over in relief, pitching four strong innings, giving up just one run on 2 hits, striking out five batters.

On offense, Jordan Flick would go 2-4 with a double, driving in a run and stealing a base. Michael Leffler would add two hits of his own, also swiping a bag.

The effort would not be enough, and the Saints would fall 5-2.

Saints Take NSL Opener

The time had finally come for North Star League play to begin, and with the sun shining on Saints Field, the good guys were able to take the "W" over the Howard Lake Orphans.

On the bump was Jordan Flick, who would pitch seven scoreless innings, scattering five hits, walking just one batter, and striking out ten Orphans.

The offense exploded in the 4th inning for 6 runs, which is all the Saints would need. Every single Saint in the starting lineup would tally a hit off of Orphans ace, Mike Dockendorf, and Ben Lindquist, Jim Althoff, Michael Leffler, and Noah Halonen would all record RBI.

Noah Halonen would take over in relief in the 8th inning, and after struggling with command in his first inning, he would shut the door in the 9th on a 6-2 Saints win and move the team to 1-0 in league play for the season.


