

## SAINTS OPEN SEASON AGAINST WATERTOWN

The Watertown Red Devils have turned in to a Class "C" State Tournament regular in recent years. Led by strong pitching and some big bats, they made it to the title game in 2021, and finished in the final four in 2022. The Saints have built a fun mini-rivalry with the Red Devils, dropping a close one in 2021 by a score of 8-7, and returning the favor in 2022 with a <u>4-2 win</u> behind a strong Collin Krick pitching performance. Head over to Saints Field on May 5th for a Cinco de Mayo celebration (\$2 nachos) and cheer us on as we open the season against Watertown.

#### SAINTS ARMS LOOK TO CARVE ROLES

As the adage goes: "It's not the new year until pitchers and catchers report". Saints batteries have spent the early, snow covered spring crafting their form and getting on the same page.

In 2022, the Saints as a team logged 255.1 innings on the mound. Of those innings, staff anchor Jordan Flick lead the team with 69 innings pitched, Collin Krick followed right behind with 62.1, and Jacob Niemela tallied 30. A goal in mind for the squad heading in to 2023 is to better spread the workload, specifically in the early-going and non-league contests. This should help keep the Saints' arms healthy into the heavy league schedule of June, and the dog days of July.

Eventually a starting rotation will be settled, but word out of camp is both Saints veterans and young guns will be expected to perform in various roles on the hill early in the year, mixing as both starters and bullpen brazos. There's rotation spots and impact relief roles up for grabs for whoever makes the most of their early performances; the situation will remain fluid as the season progresses in order to "play the hot hand".





#### **SAINTS SIGN HOWARD**

On April 17th, The Saints inked their first new signee of 2023, Jack Howard, a 2022 Annandale High School graduate, where he had a solid senior season on the mound, including a complete game winning performance and shutout relief inning in a doubleheader against the Dassel-Cokato Chargers. Gaining an arm is always a plus, and Jack will look to help bolster the Saints pitching staff this summer.



# BOGER GIVES TIPS WITH TECH TOOLS

Ask any Saint who the most consistent hitter on the team is and they'll most likely give you the same answer. There's a reason Steve Boger sits among the North Star League leaderboard at the end of each season, and that reason is the dedication to his craft.

He may only be 35-years-old, but on a team with an average age slightly under 24, Boger is one of the few resident "old guys" by default. But age is just a number for the slick-swinging centerfielder. In 2022, he once again found himself in the top-10 hitters in the NSL, finishing 6th with a .448 batting average.

How does he maintain his consistency? For one, he swears by a meticulous training routine involving the use of Blast Motion sensors. Blast Motion, a nifty piece of tech that conveniently attaches to the knob of a baseball bat, can give hitters insight on what they're doing well at the plate, and what they need to improve on. Metrics like swing speed, attack angle, hand speed, and on-plane efficiency, are all tracked.

With a combination of tech-aided training, strength and speed work, and using some of that "old man" wisdom on having a planned approach at the plate, young Saints and veterans alike are picking Boger's brain, looking to become better hitters themselves. Saturday mornings during our "Spring Training", it wouldn't be a surprise to find him in the batting cages, leading a group of Saints in hitting drills, helping them get an edge in the box.
