### weekly recap

SAINTS TAKE 2 OF 3, FINISH A STRONG MONTH OF MAY

On Wednesday night, the Saints picked up right where they left off the week prior. In a "Battle of the Saints", St. Boni came to town in their own black, white, and gold (we love their take on the Friar hat). It was a misty, cold evening. At times, the weather made it challenging, but the home team was able to come out on top.

Three Saints took the mound; starting was James Howell, who worked 3 innings, striking out 4, giving up 2 earned runs. Noah Halonen would be the pitcher on record, grabbing the win in 4 2/3 of relief. After a shaky first, Noah settled in to strike out 7 St. Boni batters. Michael Howell would take over with two outs in the 8th and shut down the St. Boni offense to end it.

Jim Althoff lead the team with three hits, and Michael Leffler had a good day at the plate, collecting a pair of hits, including a double, while driving in 4 runs. In the end, it was D-C by a score of 11-4.

The second game of the week featured the Clearwater River Cats, in what would be a more competitive game.

Collin Krick would toe the rubber for the final time in May, capping off a fantastic month with a complete game performance. Over the course of the game, he would hold the River Cat offense in check, giving up just one earned run and securing his fourth win on the young season. To end his white hot month of May, Krick holds a 4-0 record with an ERA of just 1.80.

Offensively for the Saints, Althoff would continue his stellar week at the plate, reaching in 4 of 5 plate appearances. Tyler Brandel went 2-3 with a walk, driving in a game-high two RBI. Making it eight straight wins to start the season, the Saints won, 6-2.

In the third and final game of the week, the Saints would see their win streak finally come to a halt, dropping an extra innings thriller to North Star League rival, Howard Lake.

The Orphans took advantage of some early miscues, jumping out to an early lead. The Saints would claw back in to it, forcing extra innings with big hits, including an Althoff dinger, and a Krick game-tying double. Steve Boger, Jordan Flick, Ben Lindquist, and Brandel, would add hits as well, with Halonen drawing a walk and stealing a base.

Flick started on the hill, and would put forth a complete game effort, pitching 10 innings on just 113 pitches, giving up 3 earned and striking out 8. But in the end, it was the Orphans by a score of 5-4.

The Saints end their first month with a record of 8-1, and look forward to an NSL-packed June.

## niemela ventures south

SAINTS P/IF HEADS TO NORTH CAROLINA FOR CPL

3rd year Saint, Jacob Niemela, has prior experience playing baseball in North Carolina. He just wrapped up his freshman year playing with Brunswick Community College in Bolivia, NC. The warm weather is welcoming, and the baseball in North Carolina is high quality. One of the premier collegiate summer leagues in the south is the Coastal Plain League (CPL). Among the teams in the CPL are the Wilmington Sharks, located in Wilmington, NC.

Niemela got the call to play for head coach Russ Burroughs and signed a 10-day contract. In his first game, he showed a patient eye, drawing two walks. The very next night, he recorded his first CPL hit, a two-strike single in to right field. Wearing the #6, he's had opportunities to hold down the hot corner for the Sharks.

When asked how the experience has impacted him, Jacob had this to say:
