weekly recap

TWO LOSSES SIT THE SAINTS AT 9-4 (4-4) HEADING IN TO MID-JUNE.

The Saints kicked off their week with a Friday night showdown in Dazzel, hosting the Kimball Express.

Taking the mound for the Saints was Collin Krick. For the first time this season, Krick wouldn't have his best stuff, surrending 6 runs in 4 innings of work. Jim Althoff would relieve Krick, getting his first work on the mound this season, but would be met with a Scott Marquardt home run. Michael Leffler did his best to stop the bleeding, also toeing the rubber for the firs time this season. He struck out four batters over three innings of work, giving up just one earned run.

Offensively, the Saints put up 5 runs on 9 hits, but it would prove to be moot, as the Express rolled to a 12-5 victory. At the plate, Althoff would be the brightest spot, racking up 3 hits and drawing a walk, reaching base a perfect 4 times on the day. 6 other Saints would tally hits, including a Steve Boger double.

The Saints would come right back to play a rare Saturday game, heading over to Litchfield to face off with the Blues on "Litchfield Baseball Day". The matchup between the Saints and Blues was as exciting as advertised. Facing off would be Jordan Flick and 2021 Tom Timpe Award winner, Joey Hyde.

Jumping on Hyde early, the visiting Saints started the contest with a Boger walk, an Althoff single, a Halonen single, and a Flick single, scoring their first run of the game. The second run of the inning would come on a Jacob Niemela groundball, scoring Althoff.

Flick made it through the first two innings relatively unscathed, before the Blues scored two of their own in the bottom half of the 3rd inning.

The Saints offense wouldn't score again until the 5th, chasing Hyde from the game after scoring a run on another Althoff hit, and regaining the lead, and following that up with an RBI double off the bat of Boger, scoring a pinch-running Gus Flick from first, making it 4-2.

Unfortunately, the lead wouldn't last. Another rally in the 7th would see Litchfield tying the ballgame at 4 a side.

The Saints would threaten with baserunners in the 8th, but reliever Jack Ramthun worked out of the jam. Flick, got the first two outs of the 8th inning, but a single, error, and double would allow the Blues to regain the lead, 6-4.

Dylan Cole took the hill in the 9th, earning the save and sending the Saints home quietly.
