NSL VS CRVL ALL-STAR GAME





As June winds down and we head toward the 4th of July break, the North Star League is bringing back a classic event for the first time since 2013, this time with a new wrinkle...

A decade ago was the last traditionally played North Star League All-Star Game, hosted by Maple Lake at Irish Stadium. The league was split in half, East vs West. This time around, the NSL goes into battle together to face off with another Minnesota Baseball Association powerhouse league, the Crow River Valley League.

The CRVL is a very solid league, with teams that include last season's Region 7C State Tournament representatives, Brownton, Plato, Waconia, and Watertown, as well as several other very good teams. **Tomorrow night, June 30th, at "The Muni" in Delano**, the two leagues are set to duke it out in a clash of the titans. Never fear, the D-C Saints are sending a few of their top guys to assist the NSL.

Saints pitcher, *Jacob Niemela*, was an easy selection for the league. He has put together an incredible first half of the season, pitching to a 3-1 record with 36 strikeouts and an ERA of 3.35. Through June, he's anchored the staff, instilling this Saints squad with confidence playing behind him.

Another lock selection for the league is outfielder, *Steve Boger*. The savvy veteran continues to put up stellar numbers, slashing .333/.422/.431 with 13 RBI, 19 runs scored, and 6 XBHs, all while playing gold glove defense.

In a NSL lineup with big bats aplenty, Saints second baseman and clean-up man, *Tyler Brandel*, joins the all-stars as well. TB has a sky-high OBP in the .400s, tied with a team-leading 10 walks. He's scored 13 times for the Saints and has shown off the wheels, swiping 7 bags.

Rounding out the crew is Saints manager, *Jordan Flick*, joining the coaching staff as North Star League pitching coach. He currently holds a 3.69 ERA with 24 strikeouts, and will help out the NSL pitching staff by toeing the rubber if needed during the game.

SAINTS WIN IN EXTRAS

It was a classic battle between two teams separated by roughly 6 miles of bike path. The visiting Cokato Kernels rode on over to Saints Field to take on the hometown Dassel-Cokato Saints in an epic matchup on Friday night.

Steve Schmitt would once again take the ball for the Kernels. He had suffered the hard-luck loss the first time these two teams met, giving up just 2 runs (0 earned) over 7 innings back in late-May, in a Saints 4-1 win. Jordan Flick would toe the rubber opposite Schmitt. Flick was in his bag, striking out 11 batters in a complete game, 10-inning effort, giving up just one run on a Tom Halonen sac-fly in the 7th inning.

Late inning heroics have been somewhat of a theme for the Saints throughout the month of June. Two Saints that feed off the clutch moments are the Niemela brothers, Jacob and Nikolai. Jacob struck first, coming through in the 6th to break the scoreless tie on a single scoring Noah Halonen. Then, in a game deadlocked at 1-1, it was Nikolai's turn. With the game on the line, the young gun walked it off in the bottom of the 10th with a rocket line drive into the left-center gap, scoring Steve Boger and capturing the 2-1 win, as well as the regular season sweep.

For a pitcher who is no stranger complete to game outings, Flick spun a gem over 10 innings, scattering just one run on 4 hits, walking one, and striking out 11 Kernels (5 looking, 6 swinging). 6 of the strikeouts came in the final 3 frames of the His opposing contest. OBP was .143 for the game, and the BAA was just .121.
