### **Boger Shines in First Season** with Saints

Through 25 games leading up to the July 4th break, Steve Boger has made an immediate impact with his new squad. Since joining the Saints, he has amassed a team leading 28 hits, 21 runs, 34 total bases, and 22 walks. Those numbers contribute to his scorching .901 OPS. Contributing his veteran leadership both on and off the field, Boger will look to continue to lead the way for the Saints down the stretch towards the playoffs.

### Brandel Gets Hot in to the **Break**

After a somewhat slow start to the 2021 campaign, middle infielder and clean-up man, Tyler Brandel has flipped the switch over the past couple weeks. Tied for the team lead with a .415 SLG%, TB has smacked 11 XBH, including a North Star Leading 9 league doubles. Notably, Brandel has also spent time recently at

second base, moving from his regular shortstop position. He's looked comfortable, and should take the move in stride should change in defensive alignment prove long-term.

### Starters Log Big Innings, **Bullpen Roles Carving Out**

Both Jordan Flick and Collin Krick have tallied up 50+ innings on the season to this point. While still throwing well, Flick's numbers are slightly higher than last season. Krick has lowered his ERA by 15 points from last season. Noah Halonen, Jacob Niemela, and James Howell have contributed in both starting and relieving roles. Those three will look to lockdown the 3rd starter role as well as late inning relief.


